

'Tell Brigade I'm not going a foot back!'

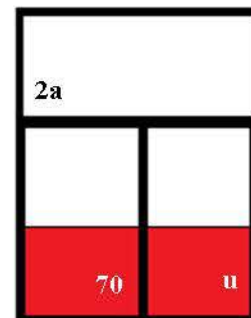


St. Venant, France — May 28th, 1940

As France fell to the German Blitzkrieg, the 2nd Battalion of the Royal Scots Fusiliers fought a desperate rear guard action so that the British Expeditionary Force could carry out their evacuation at Dunkirk. On the evening of May 27 orders were received that their position must be held at all costs for the next 24 hours, to enable the rest of the B.E.F. to get away. The Scots Fusiliers would do all that was required of them. Colonel Tod's reply 'Tell Brigade I'm not going a foot back.'



Board Configuration:

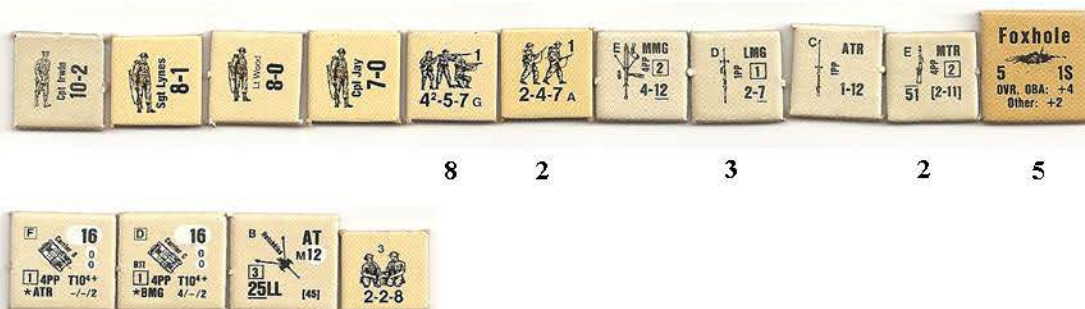


VICTORY CONDITIONS: The side with the most VP at scenario end is declared the winner. The British receive 1 point for each 2nd level hill hex controlled on Board 2a at the end of Tum 4 (21 pts. Possible). The German player receives 1 point for each 2nd level hill hex controlled on Board 2a at the end of Tum 3. Hill hexes occupied after Tum 3 by the German Player are worth 0 pts. The British Player also receives 2 pts. Per MMC that exits the game through the Q5-Q6 Road Hex on board 2a on Tums 5-7. The German Player also receives 5 points for control of each of the following 2a Hexes: F5, K10, L10, and N14.

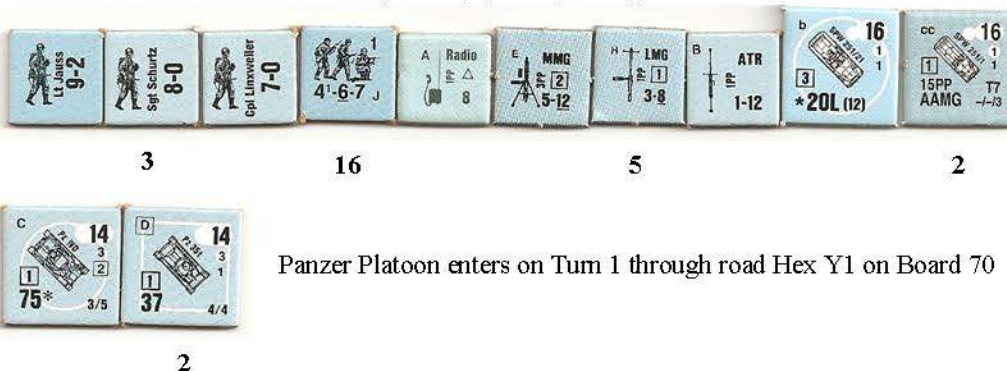
British Sets up first	+	1	2	3	4	5	6	7

Elements of 2nd Battalion Royal Scots Fusiliers (ELR 4) (SAN 3) Setup: On any Level 2 Hill Hex on Board 2a



Elements of 3rd Panzer Division (ELR 4) (SAN 2) Setup: On Board u on or East of Row CC



Panzer Platoon enters on Tum 1 through road Hex Y1 on Board 70

Special Rules/Notes:

1. EC are moderate with no wind.
2. On Boards 70 and u only Rows R-GG are playable. (all level 2 Hill Hexes on Board 2a begin the game under British control.)
3. All British Units suffer from Ammo Shortage. (A19.131)
4. The Germans have one module of 80mm OBA. (Barrage is NA) May fire HE/Smoke.
5. British Player may set up one MMC w/SMC Leader and SW HIP.
6. No Quarter is N/A. Surrender cannot be refused by either player.

Aftermath:

On the morning of the 28th composite forces of tanks and grenadiers of the 3rd Panzer Division attacked. The Royal Scots Fusiliers before St Venant sustained heavy casualties and were gradually borne back and enclosed. As evening drew on, the enemy had tanks beyond the canal bridge behind St Venant. As for the Royal Scots Fusiliers, very few stragglers got back as most of them fought it out to the bitter end.
